The St. Jude LIFE Study

The U.S. is home to about 420,000 childhood cancer survivors — a number that is expected to reach more than half a million by 2020. As the population of childhood cancer survivors grows, it is vital to understand and address their unique health needs. Researchers have learned that adult survivors of pediatric cancer have higher rates of secondary cancer, heart and lung disease and other health concerns.

St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is a global leader in research and care for childhood cancer survivors through several programs, including the St. Jude LIFE Study.

In 2007, St. Jude began the St. Jude Lifetime Cohort study (St. Jude LIFE), a project that brings St. Jude alumni back to campus to study the long-term effects of their cancer and its treatment. All St. Jude LIFE participants receive assessments based on the specific treatment they received as a child. Such testing could include anything from an eye exam to an echocardiogram. About 4,500 patients are involved in St. Jude LIFE, and the hospital has set a goal to expand that number to 8,000 over the next six years.

Jason, age 33 • acute lymphoblastic leukemia

In 1995, Jason was a typical junior high-schooler. “I was on the football team and my main goal in life was to play professional football,” Jason said. “I did well in class so I could be on the field.”

But then, Jason was found to suffer from acute lymphoblastic leukemia [ALL], and his family turned to St. Jude. Very early on after arriving at St. Jude, Jason had a lot of questions about what was happening to him. He started taking ownership of his treatment and realized he had a talent for science. Jason said, “I started to think I could help others who might be in this position, but from the other side if I decided to become a doctor.”

Jason's treatment included two-and-a-half years of chemotherapy and was one of the first to treat ALL without radiation therapy. Jason successfully beat his cancer and, in the process, found a new calling in life. Thanks to his experiences at St. Jude, Jason knew he wanted to study medicine.

After medical school and a residency in pediatrics, Jason returned to St. Jude in July 2014 as a clinical fellow. “My hope is to continue working at St. Jude as a pediatric oncologist,” he said. “Fellowship is hard. My first year was really difficult. But in my hardest moments, my love and passion for St. Jude kept me going.”

In addition to being a clinical fellow, Jason is a husband, a father and a runner who has competed in the St. Jude Memphis Marathon® multiple times. Jason is also a part of the St. Jude LIFE Study, a project established in 2007 that brings St. Jude alumni back to campus to study the long-term effects of their cancer and its treatment.
